Homecoming







Homecoming Game Night started with the parade. Different clubs, Homecoming royalty, and the class floats followed the course around town. The Junior class won the float contest and the Sophomores got second. The Seniors and Freshmen did not have an entry for the contest.

After the parade came the main focus of the night, the big game against the Blackford Bruins.

With Channel 13's Dave Calabro watching, Pete Hobbs put on a show. Hobbs returned a punt sixty-four yards with his first touch of the game. On the first series the defense held Blackford three and out and Blackford chose to punt. The punt was high and wobbly, but Hobbs fielded it safely. With the help of two helmet-crushing blocks from Senior Kevin Couch, Hobbs ran it into the endzone easily. Hobbs had touchdown runs of 56, 73, and 2 yards with 220 yards on just 11 carries. (that's 20 yards a carry!)

With Blackford's front line averaging 6'2" 223lbs, the Frankton linemen were undersized, but it didn't show. Frankton outgained the Bruins 225-223 yards on the ground with seventeen less carries. Junior Kyle Stevens had a thirty yard catch-and-run TD pass from Nathan Cress. Also, a 25 yard field goal from Junior Kenny Kinnard rounded out the scoring.

Frankton ended their Homecoming week with the 38-6 win.







Beardsley, Kinzie Hobbs and Karalee Cage. The 1999 King and Queen were Blake Benefiel and Jenny Hendricks.




Largest in recent years, 8th Grade builds memories for future.


































Both teams had victory over Wes-Del at their home field. The 8th grade won easily by a score of 42-16, and the 7th graders score was 30-0.







