









A "fairy tale victory" will bethe way many Elwoodites remember the 1992 Elwood vs. Tipton football match-up at the Hoosier Dome. The Elwood Panthers, led by senior tailback **John Wilson**, stunned the Blue Devils with a 34-21 romp. Not only did Elwood's offense produce 277 yards rushing and 37 yards passing, the powerful defense limited Tipton to only 38 yards rushing, completely stopping T.H.S.'s most effective backs.

The outstanding preformance was noticed and greatly appreciated by many spectators in attendance. Although every team in the C.I.C. division com-

peted that day, Elwood sold the most pre-game tickets, an indication of the loyal supporters of Panther football. The crowd, encouraged by E.H.S. cheerleaders, demonstrated great spirit during the game. The Panther band performed during halftime and added much enthusiasm throughout the contest with various drum chants.


When asked what the success of the day was due to, Coach **Tony Boley** responded, "The success of the day was attributed to the desire, discipline, and determination of the players and coaching staff to work all winter and summer long in the weight room. We had

Summarizing the entire experience, **Boley** stated, "After a 14-14 tie at the half we fumbled the ball on our first possession and Tipton scored and took the lead. We came back for a great victory."















# New Cultural Experiences







**Bob Goins** was named to the IMEA Honors Band and continued to the state contest with a trumpet solo. Bob was one of 800 applications received from


across the state.







# Honor Society


The National Honor Society, under the direction of Raeanna Merritt and Joan Mercer, experienced a busy and successful year.











entire season. **Reese** also scored 7 touchdowns.



The Elwood grapplers were Northwestern and Marion Tourney champions. The Panthers placed second in the Madison County Tour-










The Elwood Panther varsity basketball team worked hard this year. Even though the record was 3- 8, Coach John Hamilton said they were a good team to coach.
















Mr. Phil Brown and Mr. Don Plake



# T eacher Features









# Celebrate Life


"The people on our planet are not standing in a single file line. Everyone is really standing in a circle holding hands. Whatever you give to the person standing next to you will eventually come back to you." This passage summarizes why the organization Peer Helpers was formed.

The 1992-93 school year was the first year for the Peer Helpers with Donna Lockhart and Janet Trowbridge as the sponsors of the organization. To become a Peer Helper, students were interviewed, evaluated, and decided by the sponsors and four other students. Peer Helpers is a group of students who are trained to listen to other students' needs. Every week the group met to discuss upcoming events or to listen to a guest speaker. Many volunteers came to discuss alcohol and drug abuse, sexuality, and teach listening awareness skills. Many members of the group volunteered their time for tutoring purposes.

On December 22, 1992, Peer Helpers presented a program called "Celebrate Life," a series of stories and events presented by the members to help students and faculty members realize that life should not be taken for granted.

To become aware of the duties of the Peer Helpers, the Elwood Peer Helpers attended a retreat at Indiana University's Bradford Woods. Every member was able to attend the retreat. Elwood Peer Helpers were joined together with Frankton and Lapel Peer Helpers to form smaller groups of eight. Each group was taught how to communicate with each other, how to listen attentively, how to trust each other, and how to understand what people are trying to say.

The group plans to increase its number, form a Peer Helper group at the middle school, perform "Celebrating Life" at other schools, and become more active with the student body.





Ross Perot, voters came out in the largest numbers on record to give a landslide win to the new moderate Democrats. • America's youth voted for change: 18-24 year olds voted 47% for Clinton, 31% for Bush, 22% for Perot. • Teens' most important issues: AIDS, the environment, jobs, education. • 1993 also saw minorities coming into power in the U.S. as over 90 congressional seats went to female, African-American, or Hispanic electees. • This was the first year of the European Unification, the economic stabilization plan to remove tariffs and unify European currency. • Two years after the Gulf War, the U.S. led allied air raids against Iraq as they violated the cease-fire, U.N. resolutions. • French-speaking Quebec lost another bid for independence from Canada. • Too much unsafe sex among heterosexuals prompted world health officials to predict a huge AIDS explosion in the coming year. • Drought plagued the east African country of Somalia, while its bloody civil war prompted a relief aid effort from the U.N. aided by the U.S. Marines. • In Britain, Windsor Castle burned, Queen Elizabeth II agreed to pay taxes, while Prince Charles and Princess Diana publicly separated. • Space satellite Cosmic Background Explorer transmitted evidence in support of the Big Bang theory of the galaxies. • Argentina unearthed Eoraptor, a primitive ancestor of Tyrannosaurus Rex. • Rigoberta Menchu, a Quiche Indian of Guatemala, received the Nobel Prize for Peace.
