


a panther victory in.... *Homecoming '82*






Panthers take one

Final command


The final appearance by the class of '83 is here. As we approach the academy awards of graduation, we recall some of our earlier performances.

FOREIGN FILM STARS





The '83 Panthers will be ready for an undefeated season with three great co-captains, Rodger Runyan, Tim Collins, and Nick Long.







JUNIOR VARSITY





Wrestling




Top: Coach Hughes watches with enthusiasm. Above: Terry Morris gets set to challenge an opponent.










The Office Education Association was established in 1966 as an independent youth organization for students enrolled in high school and office education programs. OEA is designed to develop leadership abilities.





The 1982 Foreign Language Olympics found the Spanish Club victorious for the second year in a row.


