







Superintendent

When Fairmount High School became a part of the Madison-Grant United School Corporation, reorganization of administration brought many changes. Chief among these was the selection of a Superintendent for the eight schools in the district. Mr. Karl Speckhard, Ed. D., assumed his duties as this Superintendent June 1, 1964.

Dr. Speckhard earned his Bachelor of Science degree at Valparaiso University and his Master's and Doctor's degrees at Indiana University. The Ed. D. was conferred upon him in June 1964.

Dr. Speckhard's career in education has included a variety of tasks. His first year of teaching was at Boone Grove, where he taught sixth grade and also drove a school bus. The next five years he spent at Portage High School, serving as basketball coach one year, football coach three, and athletic director three.

The following seven years he was principal of the Porter Township High School at Boone Grove, his last position before completing his work at Indiana University and subsequently coming to Fairmount.

"My goal," Dr. Speckhard says, "is to provide the finest educational opportunity for all students in the Madison-Grant schools."


Joe Kimes




Tim Titus-5'8" Junior Guard


Kenny Seward-5'8" Senior Guard
