



In this 1978 CRESCENT we have preserved some of these memories on our pages. Enjoy!!








October 8, 1977 was surely a day to remember!












"A dream come true," was Mr. Hoppel's comment after winning the game, along with praise for his athletes.


"The 1977 baseball season was a great coaching experience!", said Mr. Bomholt, adding, "We had great talent, coachable athletes, and enough desire to get the job done."

The 1977 Panthers had all the tools; pitching, defense, and clutch hitting! The accomplishments of this great team will be hard to duplicate.





You and I've been around for a long, long time,

Prom 1977 was surely a big event to all who spent hours








ALL THE GOOD TIMES

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT


Junior Achievement gives high school students the opportunity to learn corporational management, control, and production. It also trains them in effective salesmanship and cooperation.




they did it with CLASS!










Mannies Takes Control



Many players were important in assisting the 1977-78 team, with Tim Meschke leading in assists, and John Talley leading in rebounds, points, and overall game performance.








Above: Laura Boyer watches for teammates to get into position. Right: Candy Dietzer whizzes past her opponent.


The varsity wrestling team finished the season with a record of 6-3 and the junior varsity finished their season with a 5-2 record.



















LEFT — Ebe Cotton and Ron McCall watch their opponent closely.



The junior class was proud to give favors from St. Clair Glass to all who attended this evening in an oriental paradise.


