










"Let's get fired up" is one of the challenges you often hear the cheerleaders chanting at football and basketball games.







Coach Darrell McQuitty's varsity tennis team ended the season at 6 - 9 while the junior varsity failed to break into the win column while chalking up nine losses.


# CROSS COUNTRY


Senior Keith Wood was voted outstanding runner for the team which was once again under the realm of Coach Gerald Burton.



Elwood, behind the reins of Coach Darrell McQuitty, played their hearts out all season long showing the hustle and spirit it takes to play the game of basketball.






VICA, one of the largest clubs, includes machine shops, printing, auto mechanics, auto body, and electronics. DECA included both junior and senior DE classes.


# We're The Kids That Came From Heaven

Now that we're seniors it seems that everything's being thrown at us at once. The future presents a big challenge for each of us and May 22, 1977, we'll step forward to accept it.












Yes, every coach has to make important decisions that can make him a winner or loser. As Coach Dickerson puts it "It takes guts to be a good coach."











Amy McDaniel, literary editor, was not pictured because she was taken to the hospital to be treated for work-


exhaustionitis. "It was a lot of responsibility, but everyone worked together and did a great job!"
