


For all of Madison-Grant's 670 students and 40 faculty members, each day is an exciting, new challenge.






The Challenge of Math

M-G's math department offers a variety of math courses ranging from General Math to Advanced Math. Currently the department is being improved by upgrading the computer classes and adding a calculus class.






Teach Us Speech





A SPECIAL KIND OF HELP

Special Education is a class that aids some M-G students with their learning. Miss Hellman helps these students mainly with their math and English skills. These students' days are not completely filled with special education classes as they are mainstreamed into other classes such as industrial arts, home economics, and chorus.

During the course of the year these students will do projects such as creating artwork and filling the display cases. This year they filled one of the display cases with images of spring break: sand, a palm tree, and sea shells.

Besides special education there is also a class for learning disabilities. A learning disability does not mean these students have difficulty in all of their subjects — usually just one. When Mrs. Foshee is not at the junior high, she is here at the high school teaching these students.

The French II classes practice ordering food in restaurants and concentrate on every-day expressions used in French speaking countries. The Spanish II classes increase their knowledge of verb tenses.


Both language classes offer viewpoints on different lifestyles. These classes expose students to customs and value systems different from those found in the United States.

Any student planning to attend college is encouraged to take a foreign language class. Many colleges today require students to have a foreign language background.









Exploring Our Past

Home Economics






Physical Education


SKILLS FOR THE FUTURE


BAND






Health



Exchange Students


Madison-Grant has had the honor of having four exchange students from Japan, Denmark, Finland, and Germany.

Many M-G students travel daily to Elwood or Marion to study such things as auto mechanics, welding, and office practice. Others pursue a college career by enrolling in academic classes.



Two-three hours a day for 3 days were devoted to the Iowa booklets and computer grade cards. 
school years.


Class of '90






Jazz Band


Volleyball










GOLF















Although they had a losing streak this year, the young Argylls look good for the future.







The Freshman cheerleading squad went to an ICF camp held at I.U. They received many ribbons and were chosen the most spirited squad.









Other clubs such as the French Club, FHA, Spanish Club, Ar-Guys and Gals had their Christmas parties to celebrate the holiday season.



All these activities exemplify the true meaning of giving as M-G displayed Christmas spirit.





These students definitely deserve a round of applause for their achievements and hard work.






