

## Students Experience Rome

Eight ECHS students and four chaperones traveled to Italy during June

12-25, 2001, to experience the sights and culture of ancient Rome. A mistake in airline scheduling allowed the group to tour Manhattan, New York, including visits to Times Square and Central Park, before boarding a 7 hour overseas flight. After arriving at the Hotel Olympic in central Rome, the group visited the Imperial Forum, walking across the Via Sacra just as imperial senators would have done in ancient times. The group also visited the Sistine Chapel and St. Peter's Basilica where they saw the Pope give his weekly message. After a week in Rome the group traveled south to Naples and visited the cities of Pompeii and Herculaneum, preserved by an explosion of Mt. Vesuvius in A.D. 79. The trip continued south to the temples of Paestum, built when southern Italy was a Greek colony. Before returning home on June 25, students spent a day exploring the Isle of Capri.










# On The Go







# A Method of Mastering Skills
























## Lady Panthers fight to survive despite devastating injuries




















# What's New


This has been a year of face lifts, new additions, new faces, and much remodeling. A building project worth \$327,000 has allowed the school corporation to replace the roof at the career center this summer, to remodel a storage room into a girls locker room including an additional bathroom, to purchase new computers for rooms 219 and 220, to relocate Mr. Max Hoppel's classes to room 106 and to house it with 28 new computers and 2 printers at a cost of \$30,000, purchase 33 red and blue lunch tables which seat 6 students per table and also 297 chairs for the high school cafeteria at a cost of \$16,000. 








# Projects help students learn Science and Math


















# Students Gain Knowledge By Being Worlds Apart


# Elwood Performers *Stretch* Their Musical Talent










