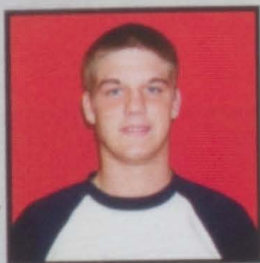

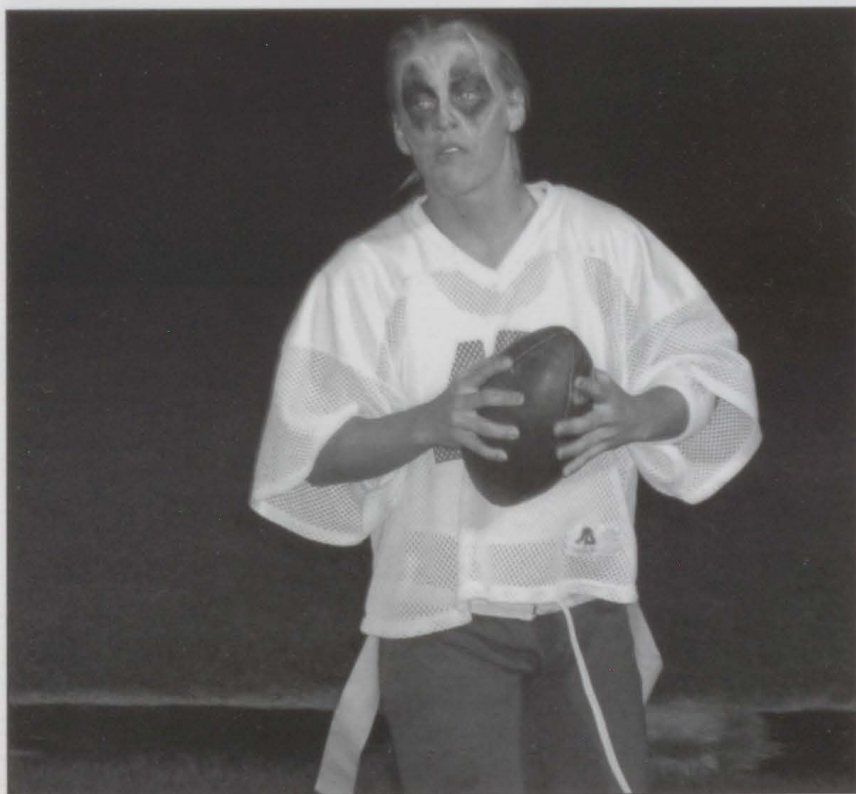

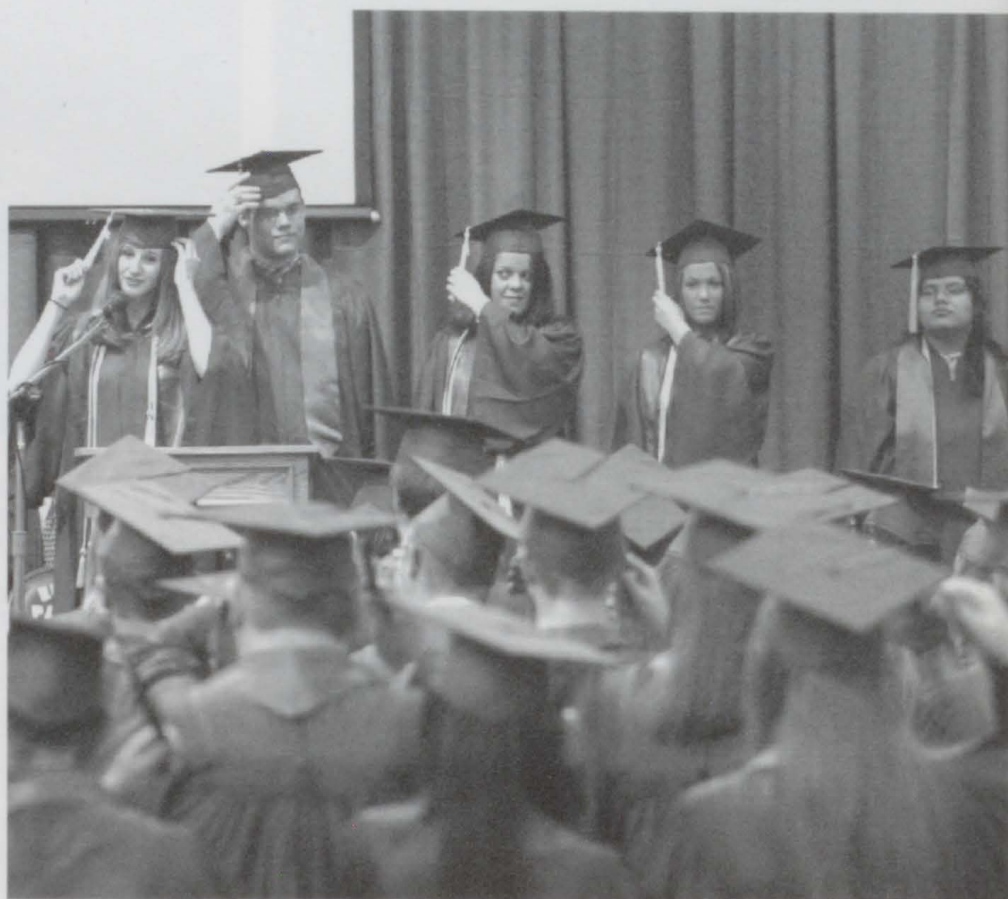

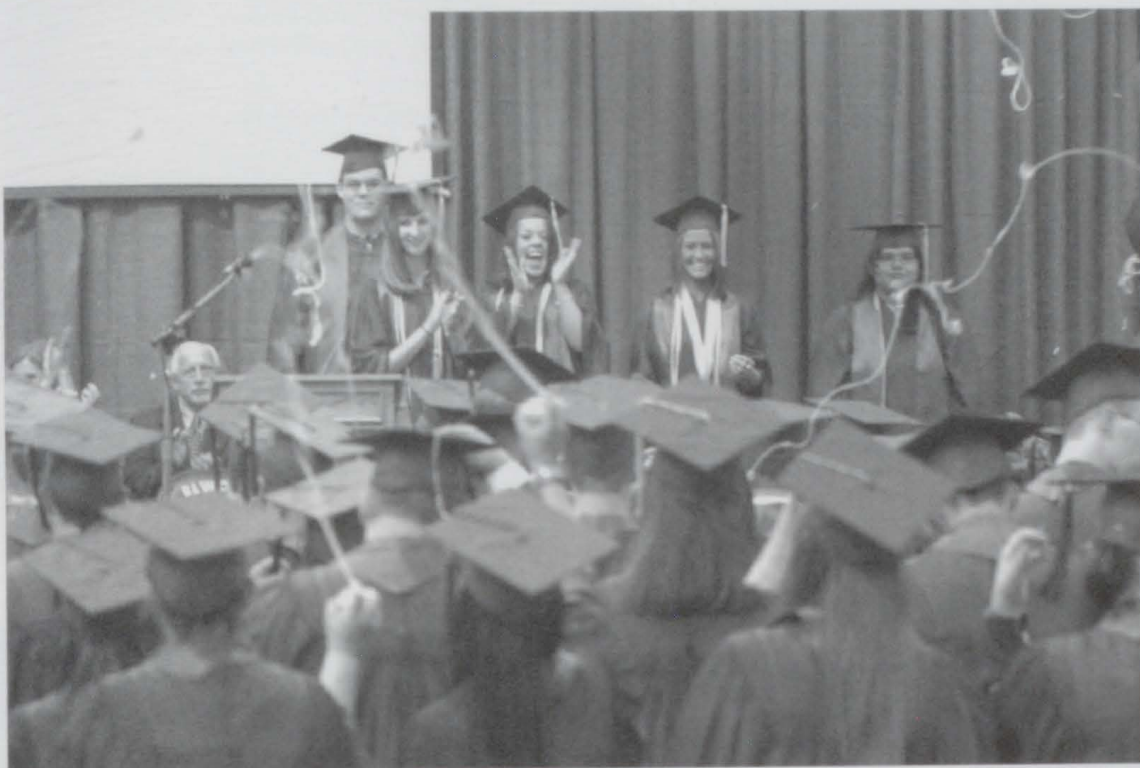

A new school year brings many new things, whether it is new students, new staff, or new changes to the school. This school year the Reading Counts Incentives program was made available to students. During first semester, students were required to read two books and take tests over them, and second semester students were required to read three books and take tests over those books. Then students were put into categories of the number of books they read and then were drawn to win gift certificates from various places in Elwood. The gift certificates were varied between \$5 and \$20.

This year the 'E-Pride' program was also put into effect. Teachers were asked to nominate students who they thought showed Pride in everything that they did in the classroom and even outside of the classroom. At the beginning of second semester, 'E-Pride' winners were posted on the front office window. Students then looked to see if they had been nominated, and if they were students received an 'E-Pride' pin and a certificate with their name and the name of the teacher who nominated them.

When students returned from summer vacation, they noticed that several downstairs classrooms had been painted. When students returned from fall break, they also noticed that several hallways in the school had been painted, and when students returned from Christmas break, they noted that all of the bathrooms had been painted.

Also new this year was the lunch trays in the cafeteria. The old pink and blue lunch trays were replaced with more up-to-date red and blue trays with a panther head on top of the tray.

Students also noticed the new gymnasium floor in the John W. Ward gymnasium. The new floor was replaced with the help of the Panther Basketball Boosters. The new floor replaced the old, with a black panther head busting through a red background.

The new LED sign placed outside the main doors in the high school offers various amounts of information going on at E.C.H.S. The sign welcomes students and visitors to Elwood everyday with its bright red LED letters.

Teachers who are new to our school system include: Frank Foster, who teaches science; Jennifer Neal, who teaches +Istep prep class; Kyle Hobbs, who teaches Physical Education and is the boys' basketball coach; and Ken Kirkendorfer, who teaches Industrial Technology.

The 'E-Pride' pin was awarded to students who showed great leadership in and outside of the classroom.

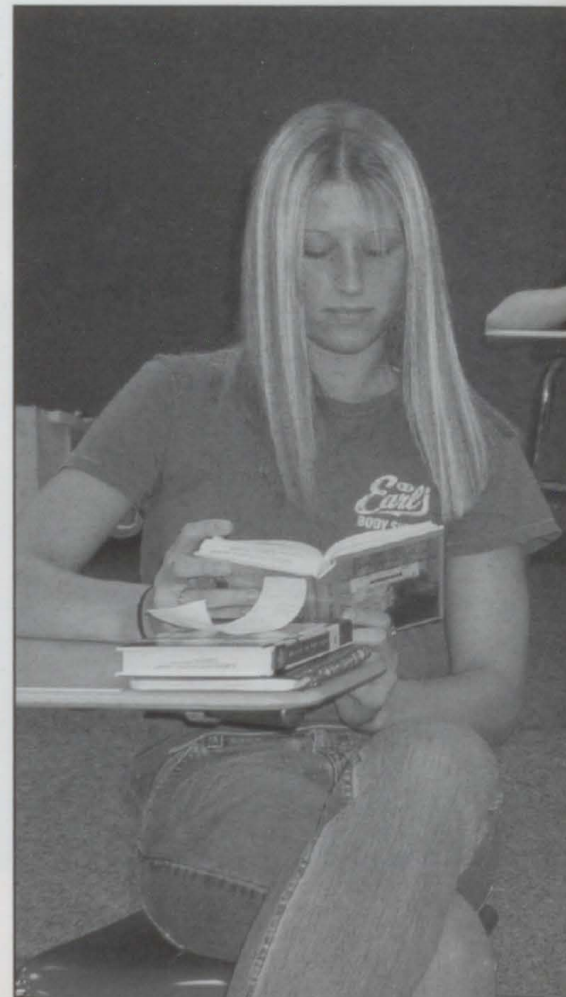


Through a grant given to the school, the school was able to purchase the defibrillator, otherwise known as the AED, and is located outside the west gymnasium doors.



The new a-l-a-carte line offers a variety of food choices for students and staff. The salad bar was also added at the beginning of this year.

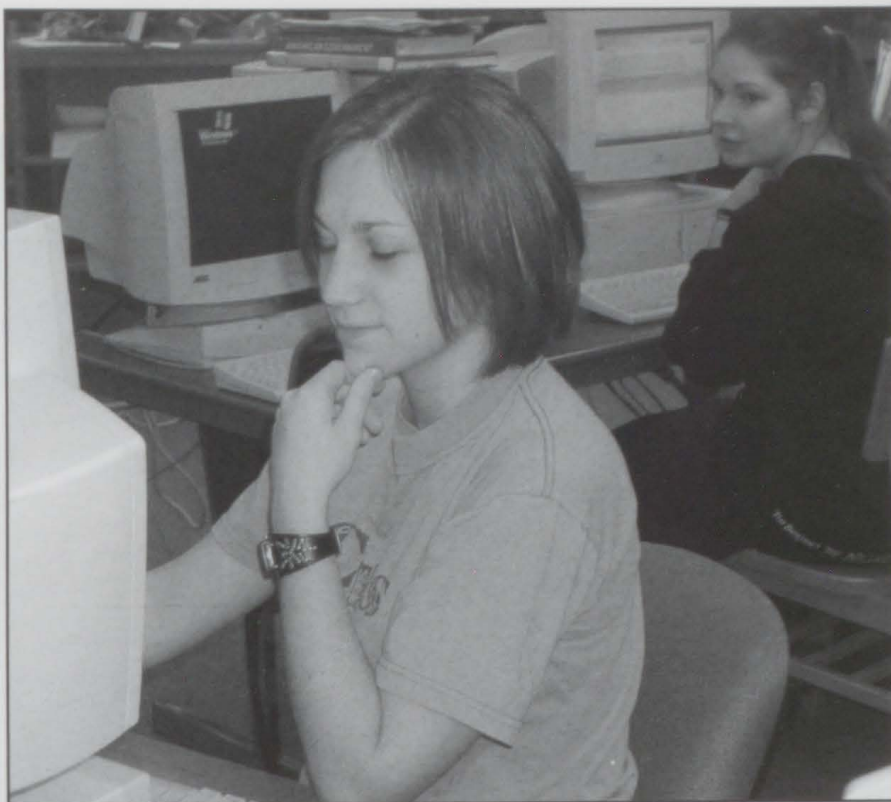

"Special thanks to all the individuals who helped work all the events- I will miss them a lot."

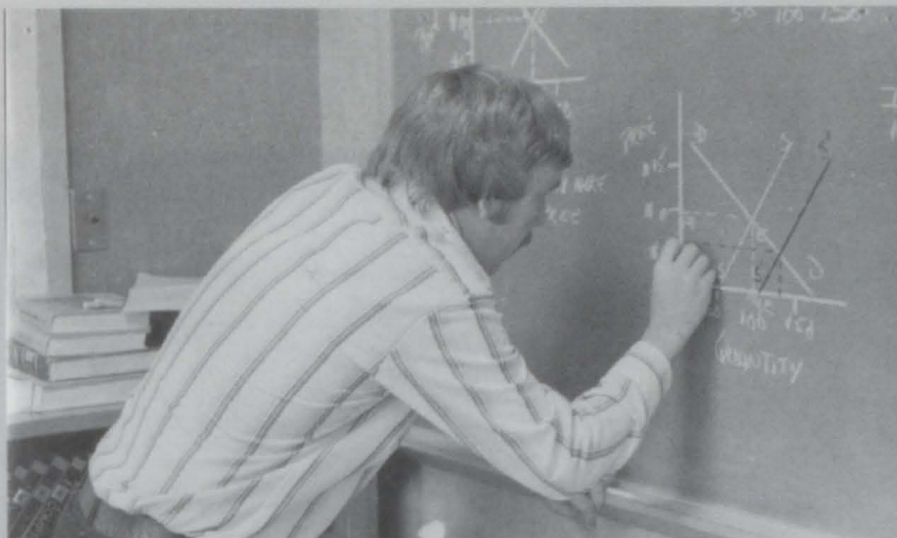

Senior Farrin Gregg was the only Lady Panther to make the All-Conference and All-County teams.

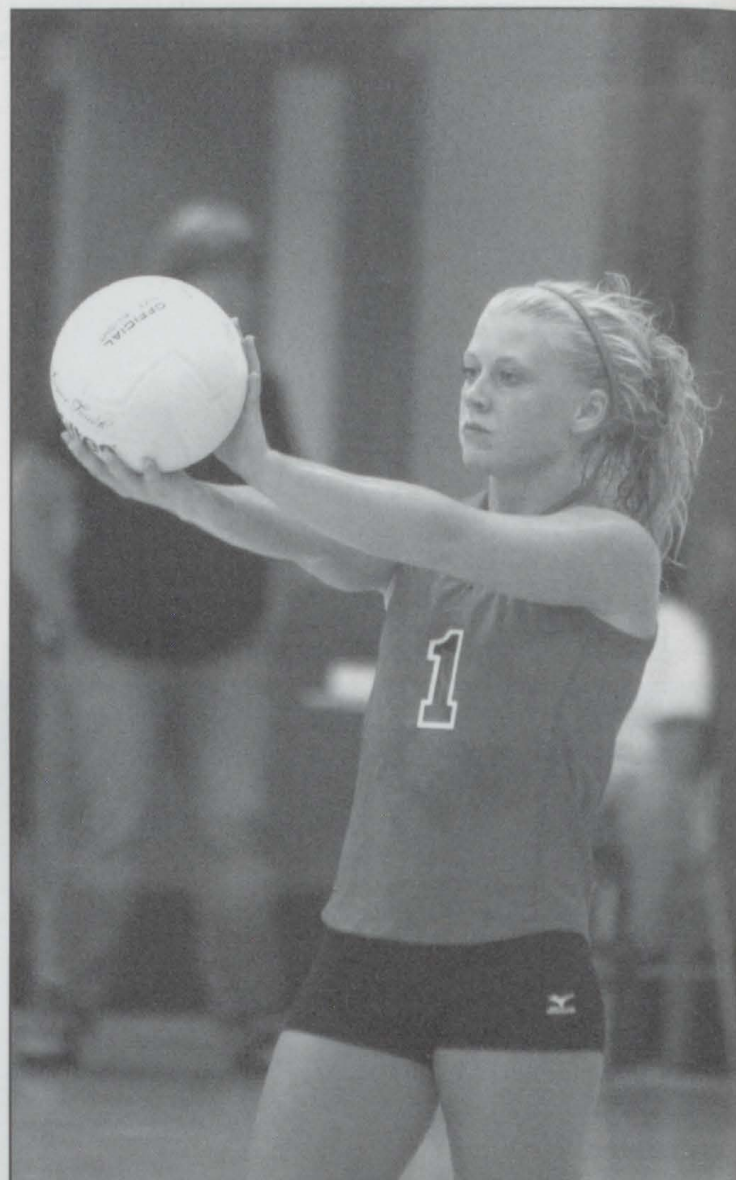

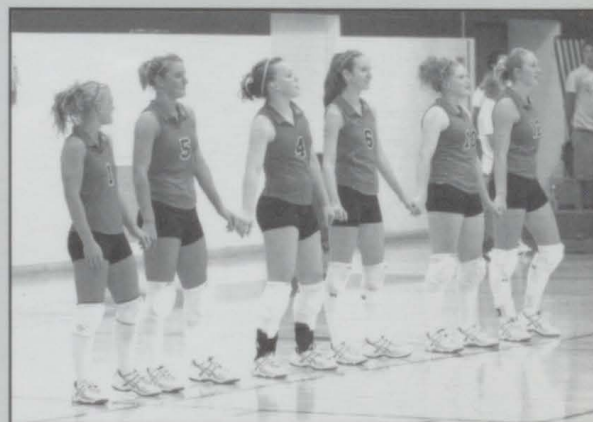

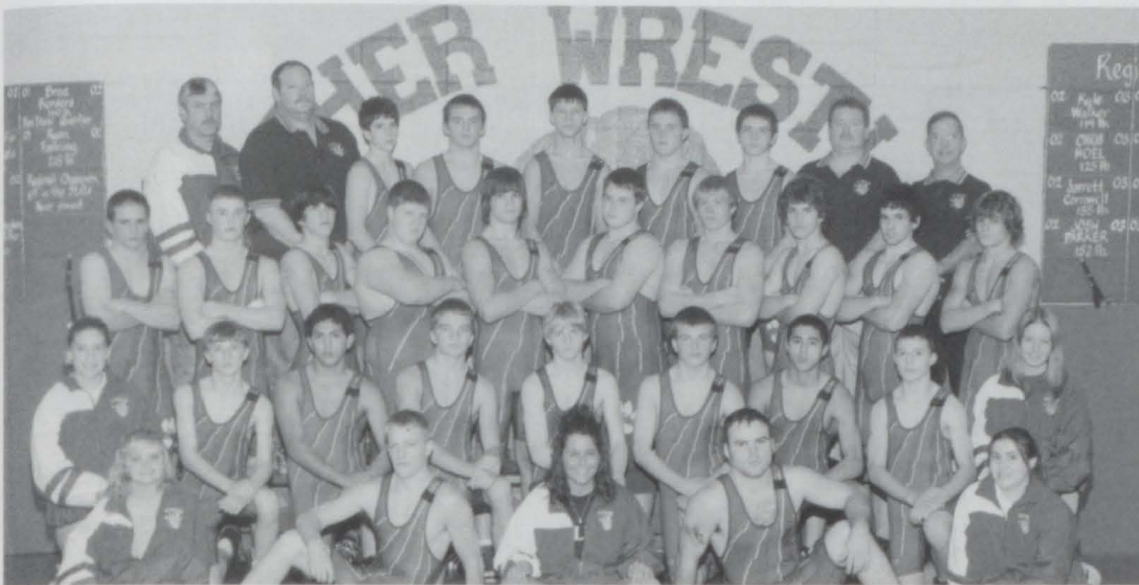

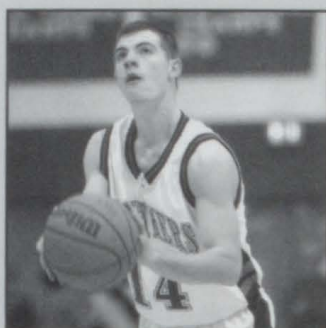

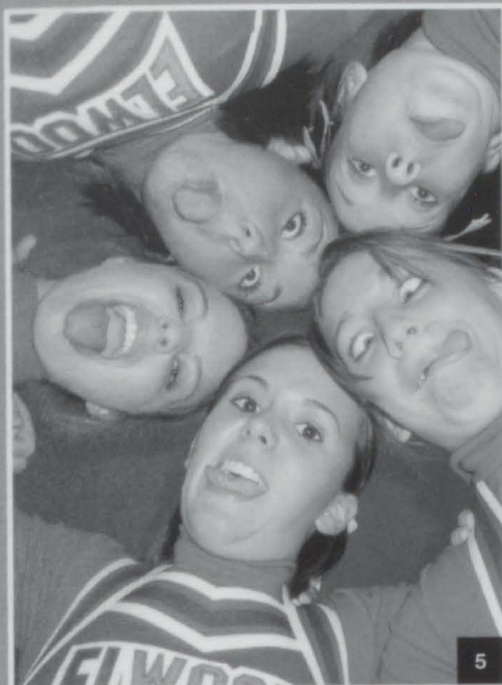

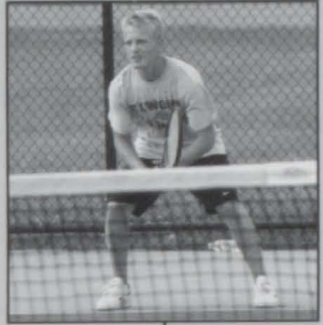

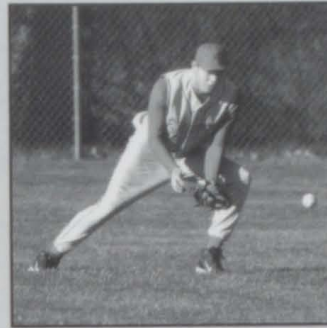

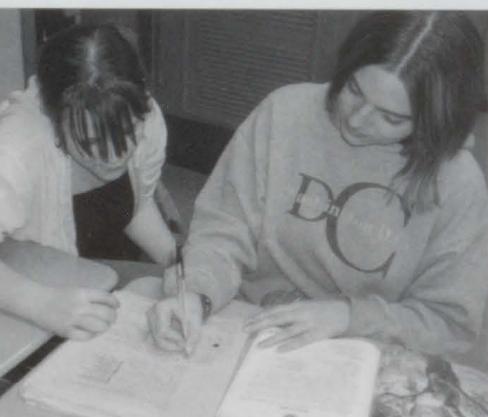
Latin

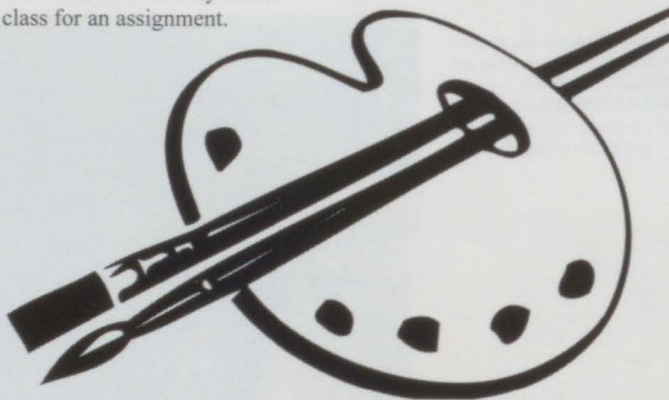

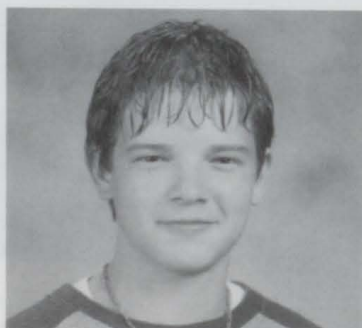

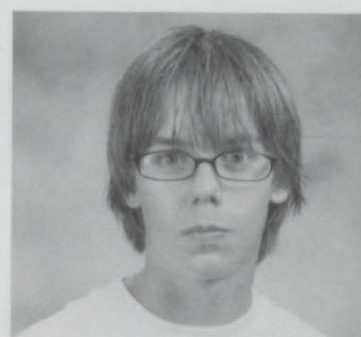

A dance team was constructed the week of Variety Show to perform. The dance team, although having little sleep and practice, had a successful performance and added some diversity to the show.



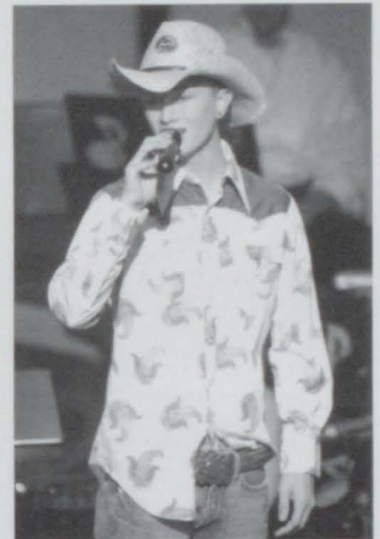

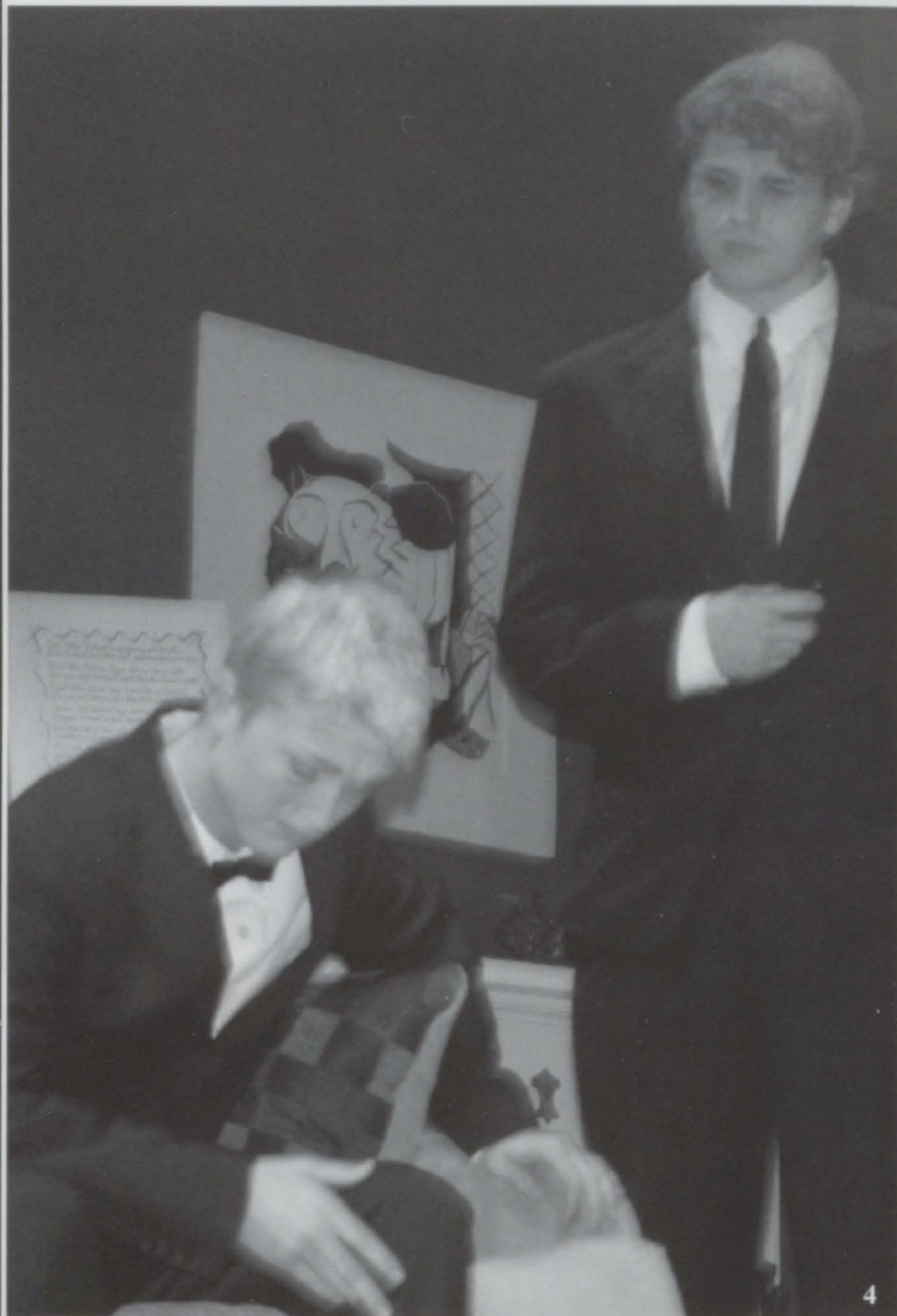

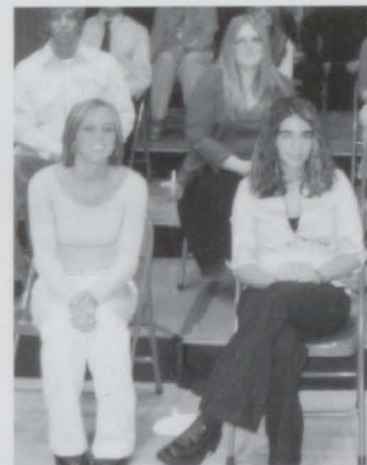

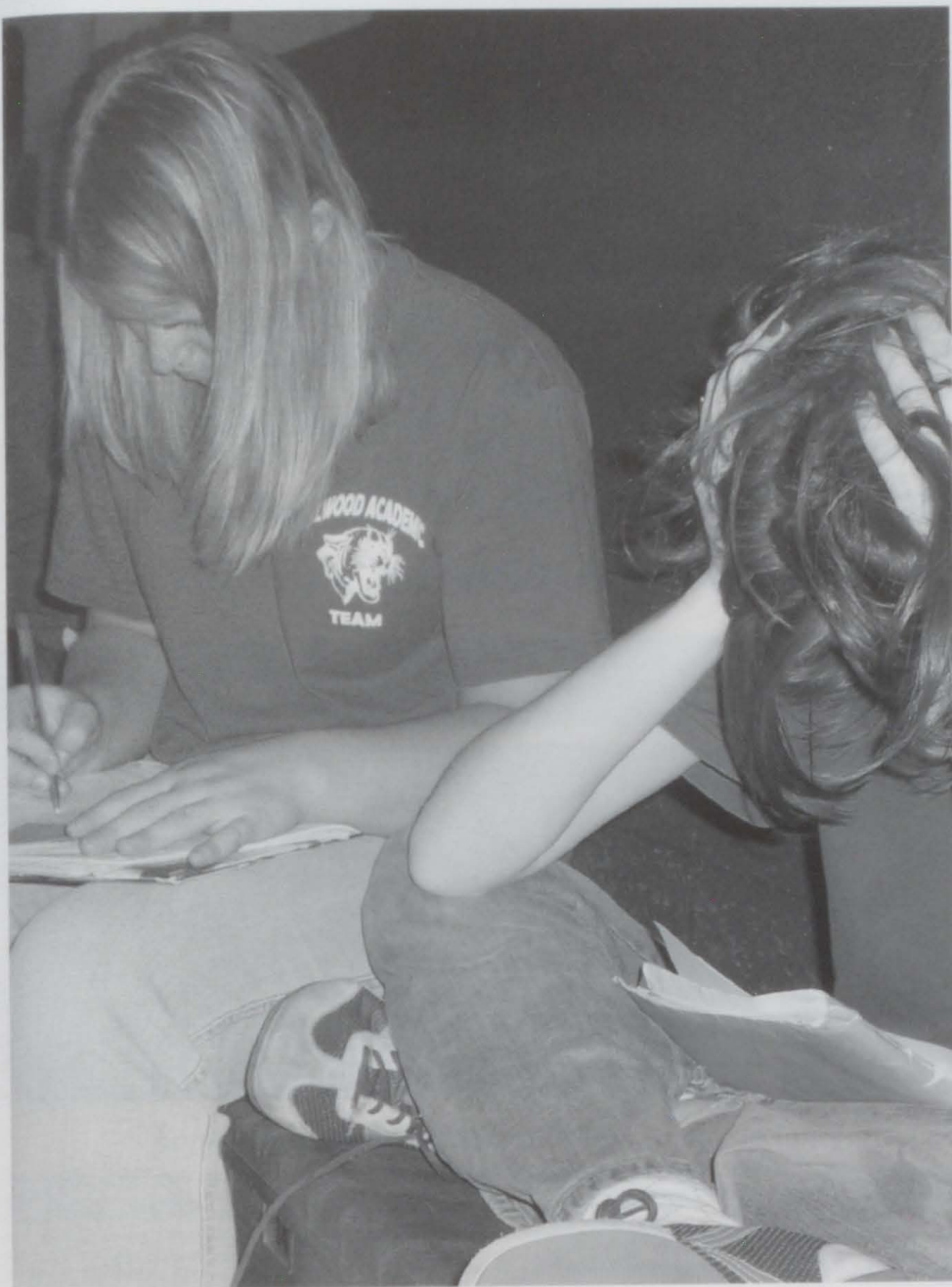

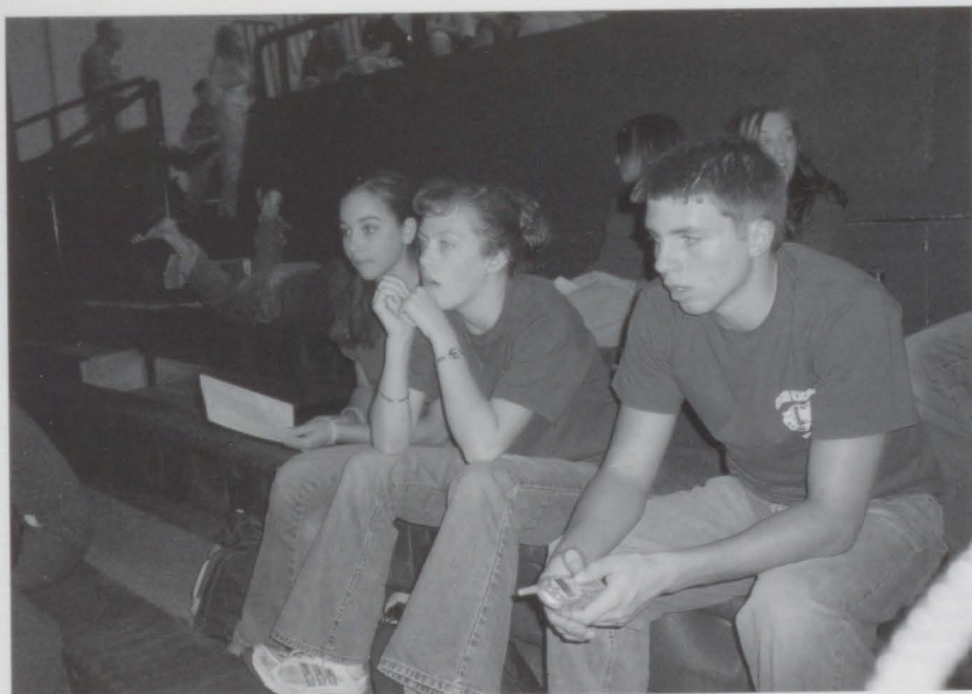

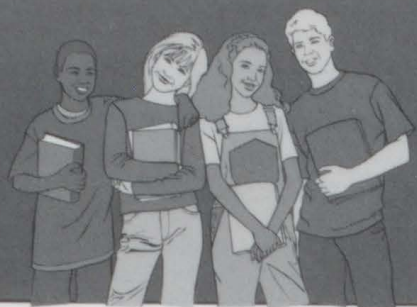
