


ROAD TO THE FUTURE




May 24 the Senior Class of 1979 started on the road to the future. Graduation day was a very exciting day for these students. They had plans to make for their future.






Elwood came up with a big win over the Peru Tigers on a 28-14 note. Peru kept the last two teams out of the play-offs.





The J.V. has had a fine season this year with a 5-12 record. They had many close games and two overtimes. All of the players have done great jobs and some have also helped in varsity play.


Both the freshman A and B-teams did a fine job this season. The A-team finished with a 7-8 record and B-team finished with a 0-9 record.






WRESTLERS




Left: Cindy Leavitt begins her routine on the uneven bars. Below: Lori Kaiser is just "monkying around" on the uneven bars at practice.








