
After passing many signs the last four years the Senior Class on May 27, 1981, passed the go sign to a life away from Elwood High and on to many ways of life.






The Lean, Mean, Fighting Machine of the Elwood Panthers clawed its way to a fine finish this year with an 8-2 record.


The Panthers tied the CIC with Alexandria, whom they beat earlier in the season with a score of 23-20.



"The 3-5 record doesn't indicate the ability of a fine J.V. team," said J.V. Coach Alan Knapp.

The Frosh finished out their season with a 4-3 mark this year, beating Alexandria, Mississinewa, Peru, and Madison Grant.






The Junior Varsity has had a fine season this year with a great 11-9 record. They had many close games. All of the players have done great jobs, and some have also helped in varsity play.





Both the A and B team had a fine season. The records are misleading because the boys did a fine job, and some of the games were very close.


Although the Panther girls did not have their share of victories this season, they did play excellent ball. The season was haunted by the loss of some really close games that were lost in the final seconds.





The season went by quickly and was an outstanding year for the three cheerleading squads.






This year the wrestling team had its own mat-maids. The mat-maids organized themselves. They are in charge of team spirit.








Our choir has been growing the past two years. For the first time in several years, we have boys participating in choir! Our class choir has numbered around 40 with the Choral Company around 75.


ART CLUB


