
The scoreboard is dead, the cheers are silent. Our history project is over. No more free golf games or that carefree feeling.

LARRY CANADAY; Purdue University graduate who grew up in Frankton and teaches Biology, Adv. Biology, and Chemistry.





third victory in float competition.




On May 21, 1978, the Senior class at Frankton High School took their first steps together toward a bright, new future.




Juniors build funds for prom, by selling magazines, records

FRESHMAN CLASS IS LOOKING GOOD








Getting Our "Acts" Together!





Student council takes action.









FCA has many talents




Working towards Business Careers





Choirs Keep Singing




United Swings to the South










FEA tries teaching

Health club awards scholarship









What's New?



Band performs at new events


WE'VE GOT SPIRIT!!!



If the team could get more of the female athletes in the school to participate in track, they would have more depth in the different events and would have a record more representative of the athletes at FHS.






The Eagles can look forward to

This year's baseball team came through the spring season at a .500 mark winning 10 games and losing 10. The early going was capped by an outstanding team batting average of .302 which led the county.








Frankton's Lions Club


