




Dedication




In the Memory of Marlene . . .




Superintendent's Message . . .

Dear Seniors:


Although this is a time to be serious, I hope you will permit me this one last story. A group of chickens were crossing Wilshire Boulevard in Los Angeles (one of the busiest thoroughfares in the West with six lanes of traffic going each direction). When the traffic slacked a bit, all darted across safely except one. One chicken waited until traffic was heaviest, stepped out from behind one car, weaved between the twelve lanes of traffic, and finally, after many close calls, reached the other side. Her sister chickens asked her if she were not taking unnecessary chances. She said, "No, I was just playing high school student." You seniors are not fool-hardy, and you do not play chicken, rather you are adventurous, courageous, energetic, optimistic, and display a lot of common sense. You are normal healthy young adults reaching your arms out to life. Your arms will go out to both the good and the bad, toward the fire and the water. You will have to learn what is good and what is bad. Your parents and teachers have taught you not to fear fire, but the proper use of it; not mere fear of water, but how to swim.

You are finishing your high school education this year and are leaving prepared to face the world. What kind of world are you facing? A world beset by problems. President Eisenhower in a recent speech illustrated the kinds of problems very clearly when he told about the telephone, a miraculous invention that can transmit your voice instantly all over the world, but it has impediments to true, free communications among populations. "Most people in the world do not have access to a telephone. This is an economic problem. Among those who do, you would not be able to understand many because of language barriers--an educational problem. And even if these difficulties were surmounted, almost a third of the world's people would be forbidden to talk with you--a political problem."

I hope that your education has given you these three things: a philosophy; an attitude; and a method of approaching, attacking, and solving problems. If your education has done this, you have the key which will unlock any door that you choose. Your destinies as men and women in a free society depend first upon your belief in a supreme being; secondly upon an attitude of serving your fellow man; and thirdly upon the techniques, the knowledge, and the wisdom of solving these problems.

What are your goals, your ideals? Will you be concerned only with the fulfillment of material needs; the making of appropriate responses and adjustments and no troubles; or will you be concerned and aspire to moral excellence and contribute to the inquiry, comment, and judgment by which justice may be clarified, equality established, and liberty enlarged among men. The decision is yours. You are made in the image of what you desire. Seeing is behaving. Set your goals, your ideals high and then proceed to fulfill those ends. This will be your happiness.



History of the Class of 1960

We gave "Class Ring" for our junior class play, and we were responsible for the Junior-Senior Prom. The committee for the prom which was May 1.

1959, at the Honeywell Memorial in Wabash, was Roslyn Carter, Ronnie Haisley, Susan Leisure, and Diana Simmons.

The theme was "Moonlight Serenade" and the King and Queen of the Prom were John Siegel and Vivian Craven. Our Homecoming Attendant was Judy Langsdon. Delegates to Girls' State were Marilyn Holder and Bonnie Dailey.

Alternates to Girls' State were Nancy Roth and Susan Leisure. Delegates to Boys' State were Dick Smith and Charles Wallace.

Their alternates were Ronnie Wallace and Tom Bennett.

Money-making projects for our junior year were a record hop, bakesale, and concession stand the last semester. On May 17, some of the juniors decorated the tabernacle for the graduating Seniors.

For our senior year officers were Dick Smith, president; Ronnie Haisley, vice-president; Vivian Craven, secretary; Nancy Roth, treasurer; Ronnie Wallace, student council president; Marilyn Holder and Jerry Rhoads, student council; Roslyn Carter and Ted Reasoner, social chairmen. Our sponsors were Mr. Fred Wood, Mr. Hugh Caughell, and Miss Marlene Earnest. After the death of Miss Earnest, Mrs. Florence Wood became our third sponsor.

We had our pictures taken by Mr. Adams of Kokomo during the summer months of 1959.

We decided to wear white caps and gowns for graduation. We Seniors enjoyed a Senior Vesper Service December 14 at the Friends Church.

The Greenies of 1960 will never forget initiation day, which occurred December 4, 1959, sixth period. We had a class party at Spring Mill State Park October 18, 1959.

During our senior year Sharon Pernod was Homecoming Queen and Vivian Craven was Senior Attendant. Sandra Bunch was queen candidate for the Valentine Hop. We presented our last class play March 31 and April 1. It was "The Matchmaker," by Thornton Wilder.

- I, Linda Windsor, will my zero hour home ec. class to Linda Davis, if she thinks she can take it.






