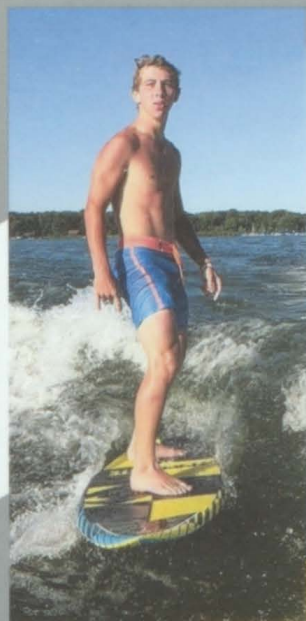
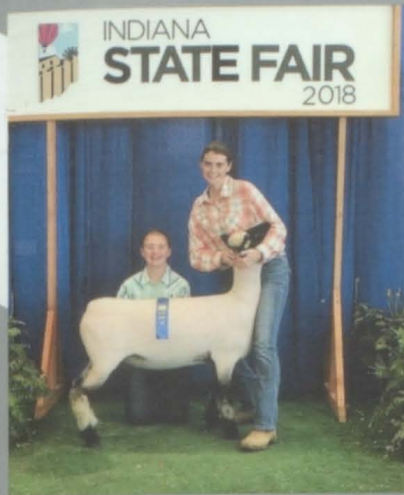

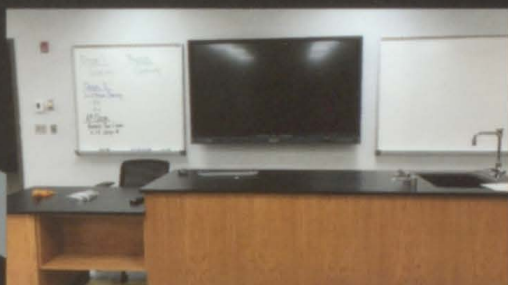

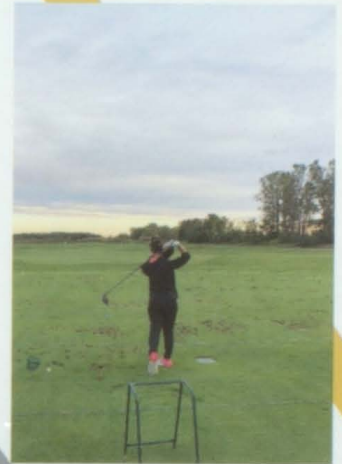

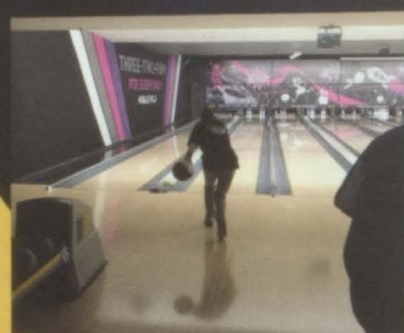

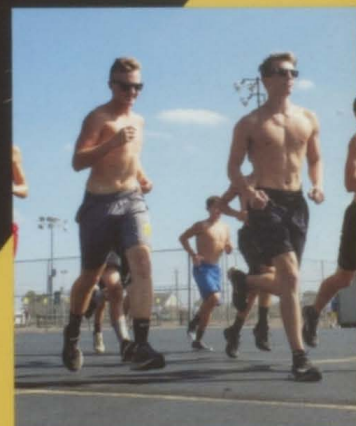

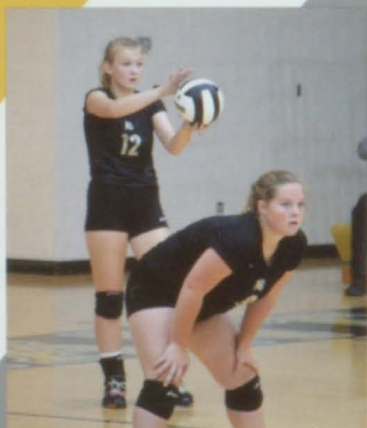

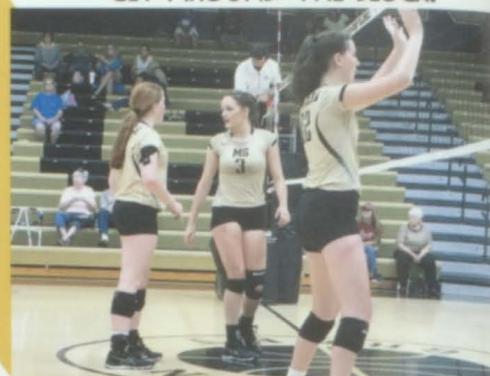

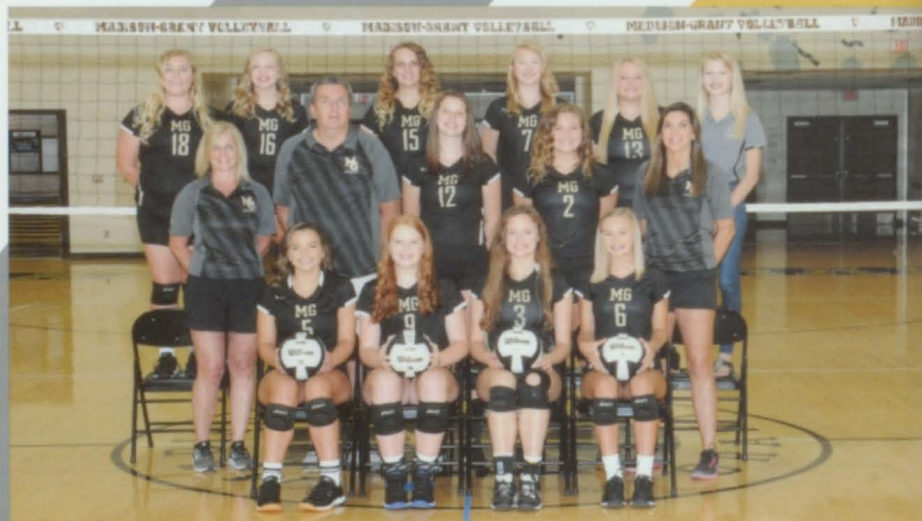

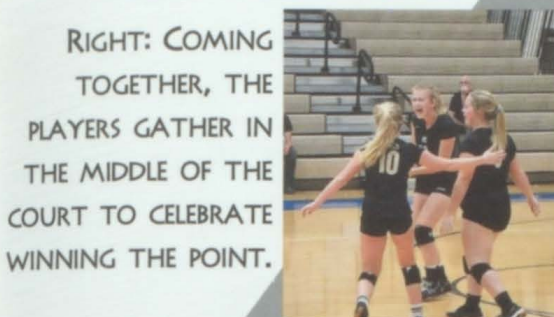

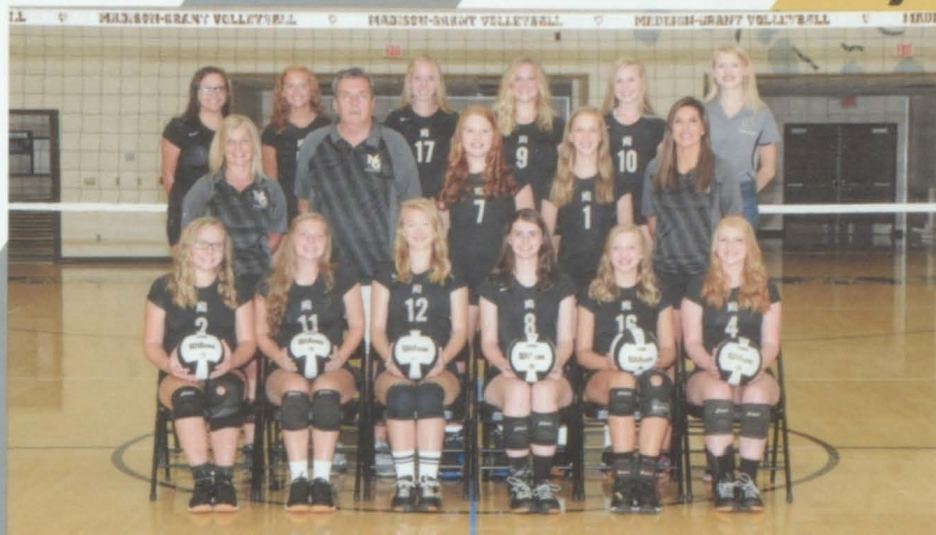

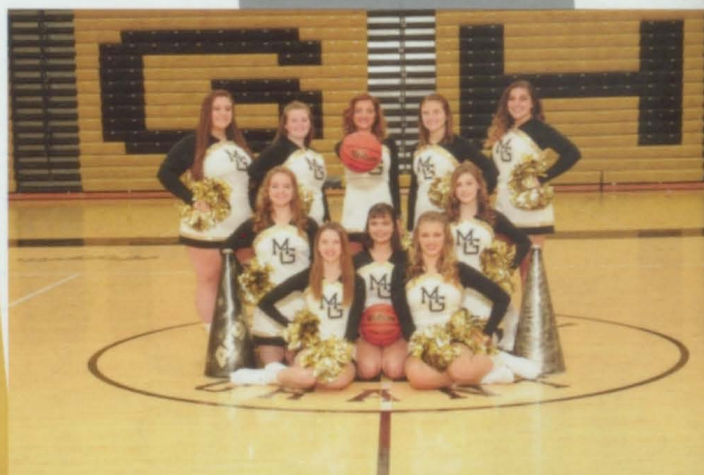

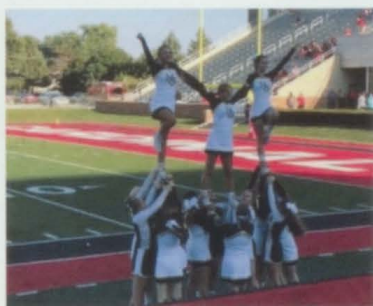

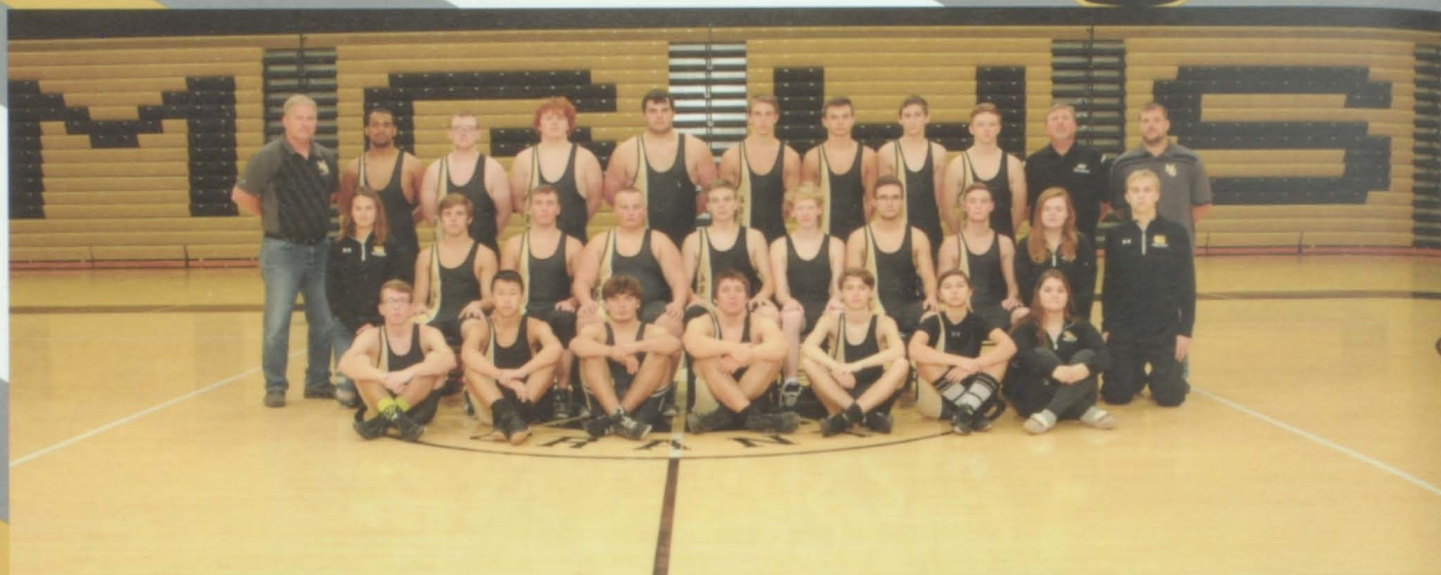

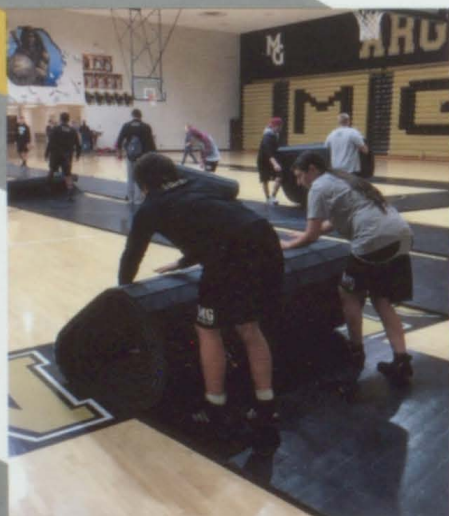

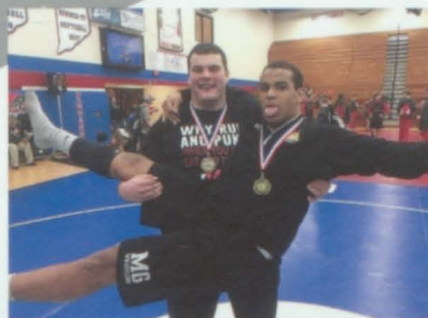

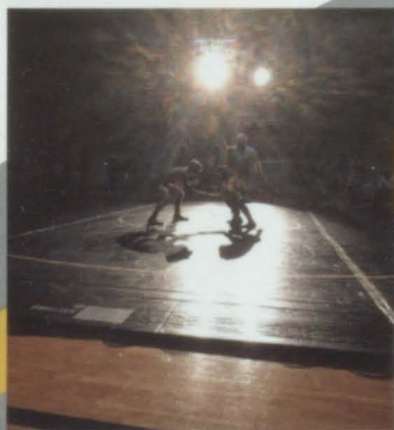

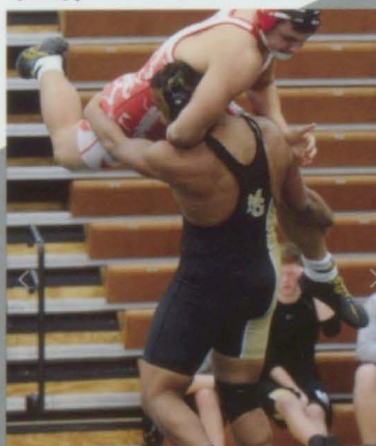

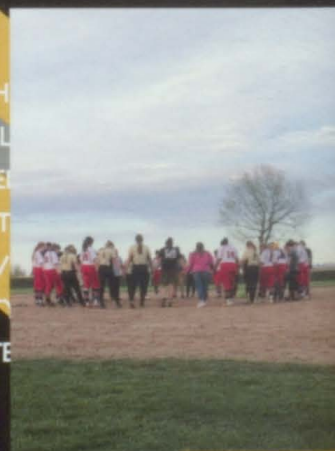

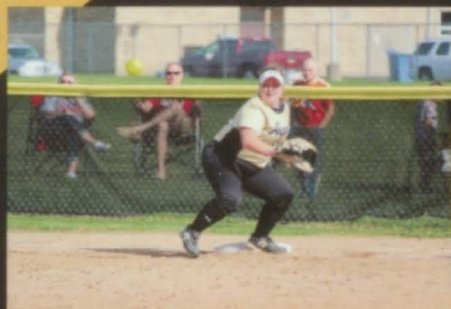

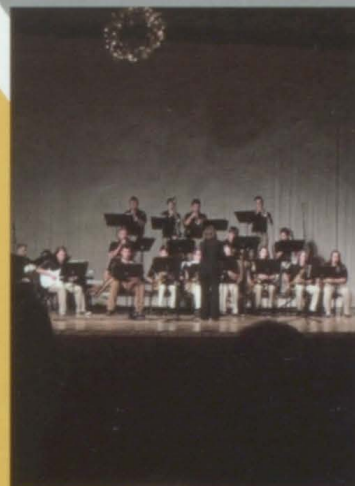

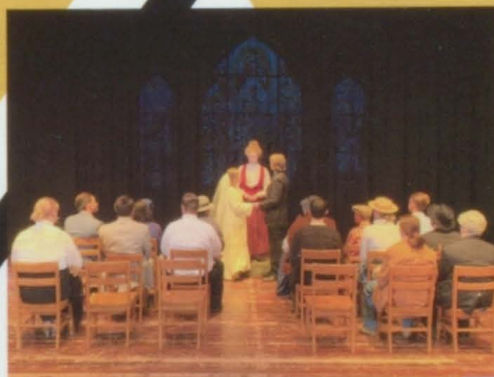

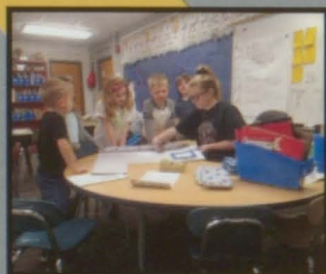

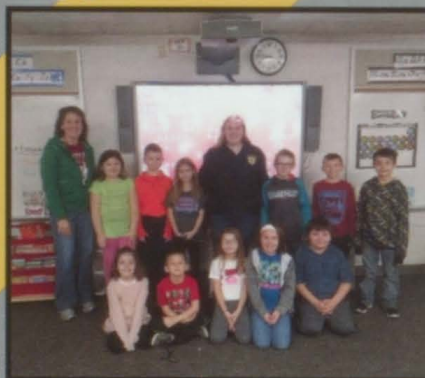

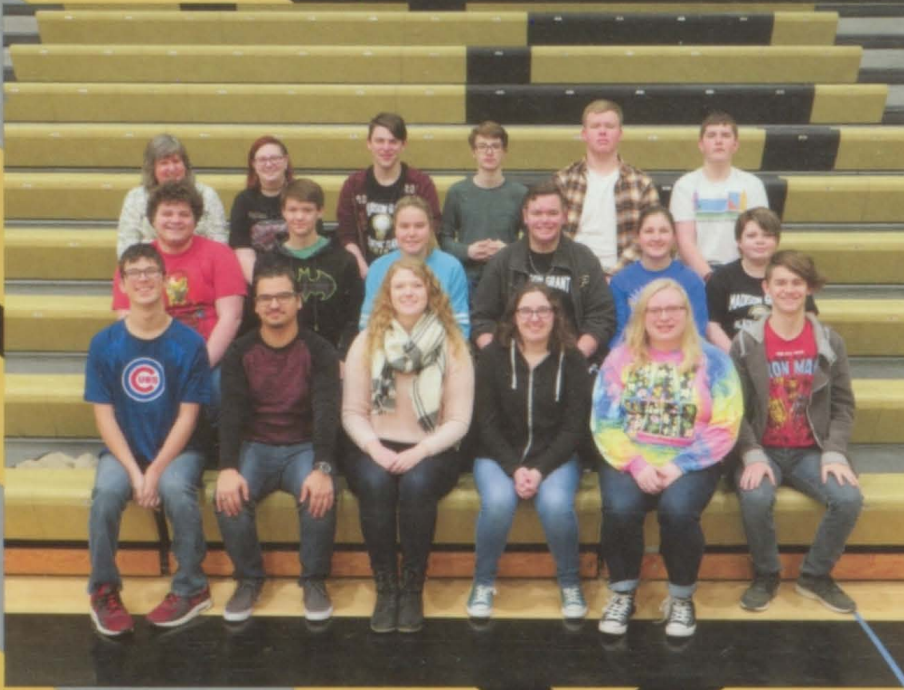

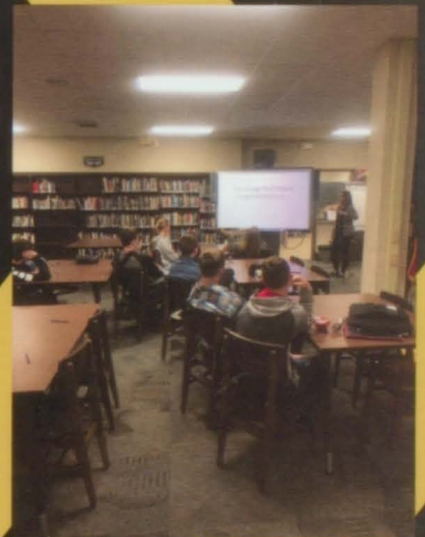

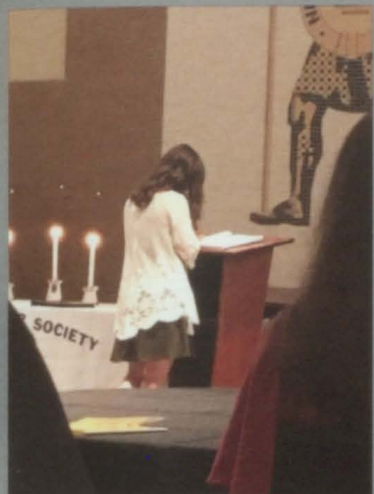

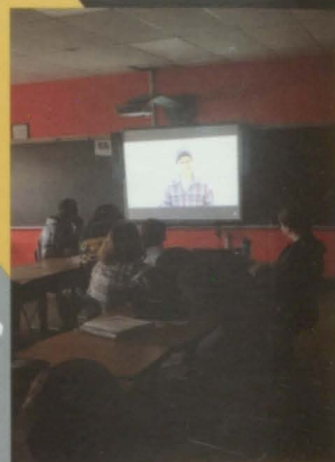

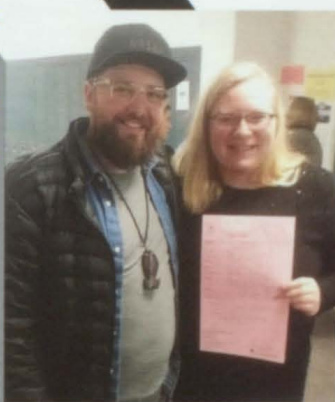

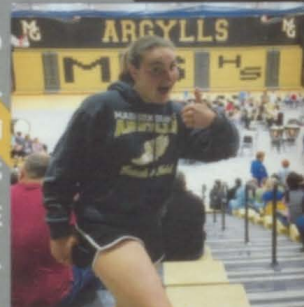

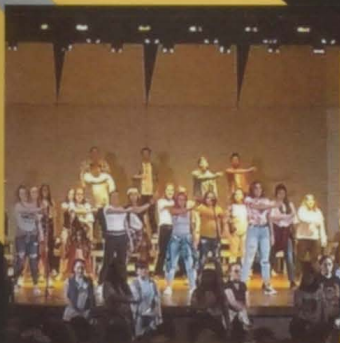
Choral Spectacular

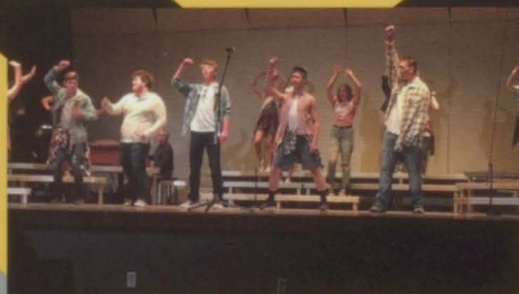

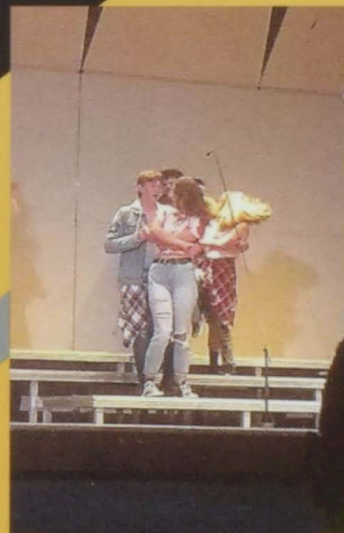

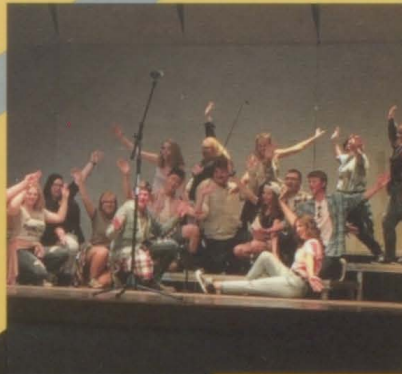

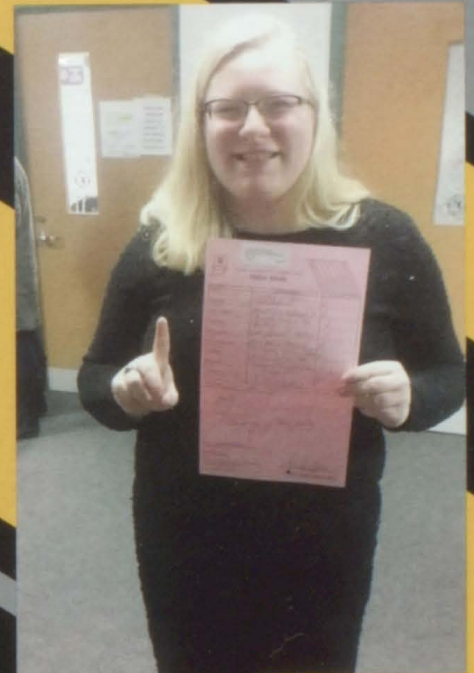

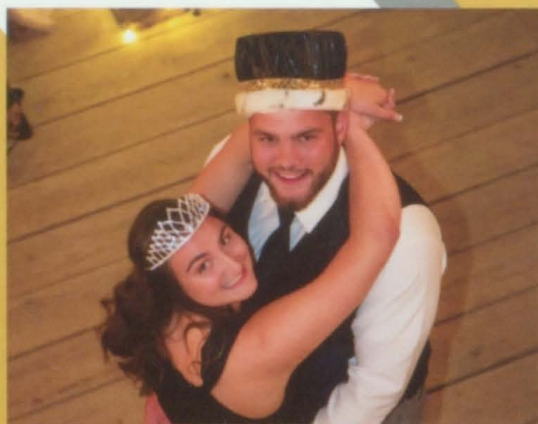

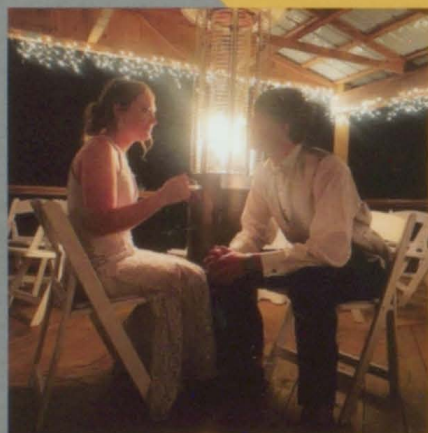

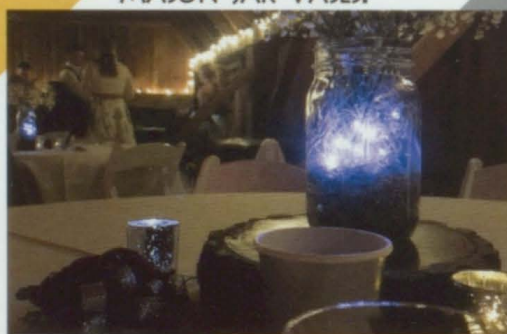

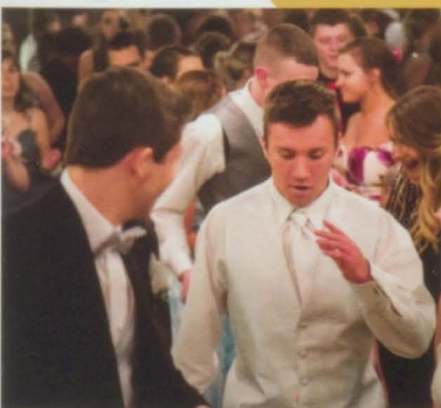

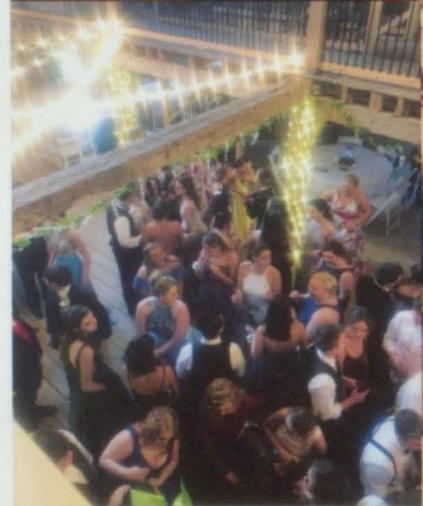
